Late Summer Programme (LSP) and Other Trips

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Late Summer Programme (LSP)

All students from Year 7 to Year 10 (I Group to IV Group) take part in the St Chris Late Summer Programme (LSP) in the last week of the Summer Term. The week is an opportunity for challenge, adventure, learning outside the classroom and engaging in new and exciting experiences.

Students in Years 7, 8 and 9 take part in a trip with their year group, usually to an outward-bound themed residential to take part in activities that help bond the students together, as well as it being an opportunity to get to know staff better. In 2024, the LSP trips are to:

- Year 7 (I Group) trip to Le Vosges and Metz (France)
- Year 8 (II Group) trip to Yorkshire
- Year 9 (III Group) trip to Morzine

For students in Years 7 to 9, the cost for LSP is divided into three equal payments and charged for at the beginning of each term in the main fees invoice.

Year 10 (IV Group) LSP

Students in Year 10 (IV Group) also take part in activities during LSP week and can select from a series of residentials and work experience.

World Challenge Malaysia

An adventurous trip to Malaysia where students immerse themselves in the local culture, undertake challenging treks and work with a wildlife organisation that rescue sea turtles.

Work Experience (WEX)

A work experience programme coordinated by St Chris staff.

New York Trip

Five days in the Big Apple with excursions including RiseNY, an immersive experience; Staten Island ferry trip; visit to the 9/11 Memorial; workshop at the New York Film Academy; visit to the International Centre of Photography, visit to the Empire State Building.

... Year 10 (IV Group) LSP continued

Loughborough Elite Sport Students follow a programme of workshops and practical sessions at the Loughborough Elite Athletes Centre ranging from body conditioning, speed lab, 5* gym sessions, use of the Olympic swimming pool, football and netball with a professional coach, athletics sessions on the professional track, beach volleyball, wheelchair basketball and lots more.

A week of wild swimming off the British coast with the Head

Brussels Space and Science trip

Students travel by train to Brussels and stay in a hostel in the city centre. Excursions include a visit to the planetarium, a full day 'astronaut experience' at the Euro Space Centre, a visit to the museum of Natural Sciences and a visit to the Atomium, as well as opportunities to explore the beautiful city of Brussels.

For students in Year 10, the LSP cost varies depending on the trip chosen, and will be communicated to parents in the Autumn Term.

Other Trips

There are a range of trips throughout the academic year, including compulsory curriculum day trips (for example to an art gallery, design lecture or theatre trip), but also optional "extra" trips, some of which take place each year and some of which alternate annually.

Trips may be offered to the whole school or to specific year groups. Recent trips have included visits to Iceland and Borneo, and also sporting trips for football, netball, swimming, kayaking, skiing, climbing and tennis.

Parents will receive letters from the subject teacher regarding curriculum trips (including the cost which is added to the next invoice), and from the school regarding optional trips.
